California Senators Bring Healthcare Workforce Shortage Discussion to the Central Valley

The Second Hearing of the Senate Select Committee on Social Determinants of Children's Well-Being to Take Place in Fresno

What: The bipartisan Senate Select Committee on Social Determinants of Children's Well-Being will host its second of six public hearings on the social determinants of children's health to study and make recommendations on the conditions that negatively impact California children into adulthood.

Why: The Select Committee is hosting hearings across California, where nearly a quarter of young children live in poverty – a fact that has profound short-term and long-term educational, health, and economic repercussions. This hearing will take place in Fresno because, for far too long, children in the San Joaquin Valley have faced social conditions and systems that inhibited their capacity and well-being. One in four children in the Valley face food insecurity; the environmental challenges of contaminated air, pesticide use, and hazardous waste impact health outcomes; children have little access to green and safe space to play; 82 percent of low-income renters pay more than 30 percent of their income in rent. In addition, there are only 157 medical doctors for 100,000 residents in the Valley as compared to 411 per 100,000 in a location like San Francisco. The Select Committee seeks solutions to create a healthier Valley and a more equitable California for all children.
